CITY OF NORMANDY MINUTES OF THE CITY COUNCIL MEETING

Normandy City Hall and Teleconference Via Zoom Video Tuesday, May 13, 2025, at 6:30 p.m.

The Normandy City Council meeting was held at Normandy City Hall, 7700 Natural Bridge Road, Normandy, MO 63121, on Tuesday, May 13, 2025, at 6:52 p.m.

A. PUBLIC HEARING

1. Council Bill #25-11 – An ordinance of the City of Normandy, Missouri, amending Section 405.705: Accessory Buildings, of the City of Normandy Code of Ordinances regarding setbacks for accessory buildings.

Mayor Campbell provided a brief background of the bill. Andrew R. Bramman, City Attorney, gave a brief explanation of amendments proposed in the bill.

Councilwoman Valle expressed her concern regarding the bill's impact on homes on Henderson Avenue that point in the opposite direction from other properties in the area. Andy stated that the City will have to discuss the issue more in the future.

Councilwoman Bourè asked Chief Sanders how the bill would affect the building code. Chief Sanders referred the question to the City Administrator. Mayor Campbell asked Andy to explain the process of obtaining approval for property setbacks. Andy provided information on the application process for accessory structure setbacks.

2. Council Bill #25-12 – An ordinance of the City of Normandy, Missouri, amending Section 405.840 of the City of Normandy Code of Ordinances regarding the manner of notice for meetings of the Board of Adjustment.

Mayor Campbell gave a brief explanation of the bill. Andy stated that the former notice requirements in Section 405.840 did not provide realistic access to neighboring residents who would be affected.

3. Council Bill #25-13 – An ordinance of the City of Normandy, Missouri, amending Chapter 405: Zoning Regulations, by the enactment of a new Section 405.758 regulating outdoor dining as an accessory use.

Mayor Campbell gave a brief explanation of the recommendation from the Planning and Zoning Commission.

Ken Moore stated that Hunny's Café and Wine Bar has an interest in the bill becoming an ordinance so outdoor seating may be offered to customers and smoking patrons.

Councilman Evans inquired about setbacks for outdoor dining. Andy stated that outdoor dining would be regulated by a permit application, permitting process, and site plan review.

LaShonda Grimes stated that she was in favor of outdoor fining and the change would signal economic development in the City of Normandy.

Rick Nelson stated that the Great Street Initiative was begun to provide beautification of the Natural Bridge Corridor and was in support of outdoor dining, adding to the aesthetic of the City.

On the motion made by Councilman Sachsenheimer, seconded by Councilman Evans, the City Council closed the public hearing at 6:51 p.m.

B. REGULAR MEETING

1. ROLL CALL

Council members present: Steven Sachsenheimer, Karen Cleveland, Tony Evans, Anthony Washington, Julia Bourè, Ernestine Shivers, Julian Roberts, and Victoria Valle.

Council member(s) absent: none.

Also present: Mayor Yolanda Campbell, Martin Corcoran, Interim City Administrator; Khianna C. DeGarmo, City Clerk; Andrew R. Bramman, City Attorney; and Col. Tameika Sanders, Chief of Police.

2. APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

On the motion made by Councilman Sachsenheimer, seconded by Councilwoman Cleveland, the City Council voted to approve the agenda. All in favor; none opposed.

C. APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA

On the motion made by Councilman Washington, seconded by Councilman Sachsenheimer, the City Council voted to approve the consent agenda of the May 13, 2025, City Council meeting. All in favor; none opposed.

D. OATH OF OFFICE

1. Administer Oath of Office for Elected Officials

Khianna C. DeGarmo, City Clerk, administered the oath of office for Mayor Campbell, Karen Cleveland, Anthony Washington, Julia Bourè, and Julian Roberts.

E. PRESENTATIONS OF PETITIONERS, REMONSTRATIONS, COMPLAINTS, AND REQUESTS

1. Citizen Comments

- a. *K. Moore* congratulated newly elected and re-elected officials. She gave a reminder to council members regarding ethics and conflicts of interest. She addressed Andy directly, urging him to do the right thing. Ms. Moore requested that the message board colors be changed for easier viewing. She stated that she would like to see missing street signs replaced, street cleaning to be performed, and for the City to do better planning.
- **b.** *Carlotta Harris* reported an issue with Waste Management bulk pickup program and her displeasure with the frequency of bulk pickup.

F. REPORT OF OFFICERS

1. MAYOR

Mayor Campbell thanked residents for exercising their right to vote. She shared her vision for the City of Normandy with those present. She announced open positions within City Staff, Public Works Director, and City Administrator.

Mayor Campbell reported that the creation of homeownership classes to offer to the public is coming soon, and Hoelzel Park reopening is approaching. She stated that changes to the Missouri state budget will affect municipalities. She encouraged public engagement in the budgeting process. She reported a coming collaboration with Waste Management and Missouri Botanical Garden for a grant providing foliage within the Natural Bridge medians. Mayor Campbell stated that Waste Management will be hosting another community service day at City Hall on May 16, 2025, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., and on May 23, 2025, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Mayor Campbell stated that the fountain at the Natural Bridge roundabout requires major maintenance, and she would like to create a plan to repair the fountain. She urged the public to be active within the community and encouraged residents to engage with the City through its website and social media.

2. COUNCILMEMBERS

Councilman Sachsenheimer reported that with the Missouri American Water Project Clear pipe replacement in the area, he has heard many complaints regarding the poor installation of temporary street patching. He reminded residents that the work being done is only phase one of the project, and they intend to repave areas affected once the project has been completed.

Councilwoman Cleveland requested more police visibility in Ward 1. She stated that concerned residents seem to fear retaliation from their neighbors should they call the police about issues they have seen. She reminded residents that with the Independence Day holiday approaching, fireworks in the City of Normandy are illegal.

Councilman Washington reported that there is a missing street sign at the intersection of Horizon Drive and Skyview Drive. He inquired about the availability of vector control. He announced the Hoelzel Park reopening on May 24, 2025, from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. He stated that the Park Advisory Board will also be hosting Shakespeare in the Park on September 5, 2025. Councilman Washington announced the Jazz Fest will be at Core Collective at St. Vincent on October 10, 2025. He also reported many cases of high grass properties in Ward 2.

Councilman Evans reported a missing street sign at the intersection of Colton Drive and Belwood Drive. He reminded City staff that the water must be turned on at the concession stand in Hoelzel Park. He announced that Redbird Rookies will be kicking off their season at Hoelzel Park reopening with a T-ball game.

Councilwoman Bourè introduced herself to the public. She encouraged residents to reach out to her with their concerns. She read aloud a speech she wrote ahead of the meeting to those present.

Councilwoman Shivers apologized for being unable to physically attend the meeting. She congratulated newly elected and re-elected officials. She reported noise disturbance from Waste Management trash trucks.

Councilman Roberts introduced himself to the public. He announced housing vacancies in Ward 4.

Councilwoman Valle introduced herself to the public. She expressed her concern regarding street restoration at the close of Project Clear. She encouraged residents to document the street work being done near their properties. Councilwoman Valle inquired about the demolition of the nuisance properties in the former Glen Eco Park area. She reported that fence line maintenance has begun with Glen Echo Country Club and hoped that the maintenance would be a collaborative effort. She reported that the park in that area also required maintenance.

3. CITY ADMINISTRATOR

Martin Corcoran, Interim City Administrator, provided a brochure intended to be used in the recruitment process to fill the vacant City Administrator position. He reported that the interview process to fill the Public Works Director position has come to two finalists and hopes to present a recommendation to the City Council at the June 10, 2025, City Council meeting. Marty also stated that the Public Works Laborer position was soon to be filled, once preemployment screening had been completed.

4. CITY TREASURER

Charles Ellis, City Treasurer, gave a verbal recap of his financial narrative of the March 2025 financials.

On the motion made by Councilman Evans, seconded by Councilman Sachsenheimer, the City Council voted to approve the financial report for March 2025. All in favor; none opposed.

H. NEW BUSINESS

1. Election of the President Pro Tem of the City Council

Three nominations from the floor were made in favor of Councilman Sachsenheimer, Councilwoman Bourè, and Councilwoman Valle.

On the motion made by Councilwoman Cleveland, seconded by Councilman Evans, the City Council voted to elect Councilman Sachsenheimer as President Pro Tem of the City Council. All in favor; Anthony Washington, Julia Bourè, Ernestine Shiver, and Victoria Valle opposed; Mayor Campbell voted in favor.

On the motion made by Councilwoman Bourè, seconded by Councilwoman Shivers, the City Council voted to elect Councilwoman Bourè as President Pro Tem of the City Council. All in favor; Steve Sachsenheimer, Karen Cleveland, Anthony Washington, Tony Evans, Julian Roberts, and Victoria Valle opposed.

Councilwoman Valle moved to elect herself as President Pro Tem of the City Council, but lacking a second the motion died.

2. Council Bill #25-11 – An ordinance of the City of Normandy, Missouri, amending Section 405.705: Accessory Buildings, of the City of Normandy Code of Ordinances regarding setbacks for accessory buildings.

On the motion made by Councilman Sachsenheimer, seconded by Councilman Roberts, Mayor Campbell gave the first reading of Council Bill #25-11. All in favor; none opposed.

3. Council Bill #25-12 – An ordinance of the City of Normandy, Missouri, amending Section 405.840 of the City of Normandy Code of Ordinances regarding the manner of notice for meetings of the Board of Adjustment.

On the motion made by Councilwoman Bourè, seconded by Councilman Evans, Mayor Campbell gave the first reading of Council Bill #25-12. All in favor; none opposed.

4. Council Bill #25-13 – An ordinance of the City of Normandy, Missouri, amending Chapter 405: Zoning Regulations, by the enactment of a new Section 405.758 regulating outdoor dining as an accessory use.

On the motion made by Councilman Evans, seconded by Councilwoman Cleveland, Mayor Campbell gave the first reading of Council Bill #25-13. All in favor; none opposed. On the motion made by Councilman Evans, seconded by Councilman Sachsenheimer, Mayor Campbell gave the second reading. All in favor; none opposed.

Bill #25-13 became Ordinance #837, on the motion made by Councilwoman Cleveland, seconded by Councilman Sachsenheimer, and by the following roll call vote of councilmembers voting in favor: Steven Sachsenheimer, Karen Cleveland, Anthony Washington, Tony Evans, Ernestine Shivers, Julia Bourè, Julian Roberts, and Victoria Valle; none opposed nor absent.

5. Council Bill #25-14 – An ordinance of the City of Normandy, Missouri, amending Section 8.6 of the City of Normandy Personnel Policy Manual.

On the motion made by Councilman Washington, seconded by Councilman Roberts, Mayor Campbell gave the first reading of Council Bill #25-14. All in favor; none opposed.

6. Resolution #25-24 – A resolution of the City of Normandy, Missouri, authorizing the Mayor to grant an easement to Ameren Missouri across 7302 Pasadena Boulevard in the City of Normandy.

On the motion made by Councilman Washington, seconded by Councilman Evans, the City Council voted to approve resolution #25-24, authorizing the Mayor to grant an easement to Ameren Missouri across 7302 Pasadena Boulevard in the City of Normandy. All in favor; none opposed.

7. Resolution #25-25 – A resolution of the City of Normandy, Missouri, appointing a member of the Planning and Zoning Commission.

On the motion made by Councilwoman Cleveland, seconded by Councilman Sachsenheimer, the City Council voted to approve resolution #25-25, appointing a member of the Planning and Zoning Commission. All in favor; none opposed.

8. Discussion of Juneteenth Day parade participation.

Mayor Campbell informed the City Council that she was approached by Neighbors Impacting Communities for participation in the Juneteenth Day Parade in Soulard. She stated that if the City would like to be a part of the parade, a City vehicle and banner would be needed. She stated that the parade would also feature a battle of the bands and hoped that Normandy High School would participate. The participation fee is \$25.

9. Discussion of the cancellation of May 22, 2025, City Council Workshop Meeting.

On the motion made by Councilman Evans, seconded by Councilman Washington, the City Council voted to cancel the May 22, 2025, City Council Workshop meeting. All in favor; none opposed.

I. CITIZEN COMMENTS

1. *K. Moore*, 7826 Skyview Drive, provided feedback regarding the use of Robert's Rules of Order and the City Attorney in City Council meetings. She made a complaint regarding the lack of communication from the City to residents and the state of streets in the City of Normandy and inquired when the street reconstruction project would begin.

J. CLOSED SESSION (RSMO 610:021-1,3)

There was no closed session at that time.

K. ADJOURNMENT

On the motion made by Councilman Evans, seconded by Councilman Washington, the City Council adjourned the meeting at 8:13 p.m. All in favor; none opposed.



AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF NORMANDY, MISSOURI AMENDING SECTION 405.705: ACCESSORY BUILDINGS, OF THE CITY OF NORMANDY CODE OF ORDINANCES REGARDING SETBACKS FOR ACCESSORY BUILDINGS.
WHEREAS, § 89.020, RSMo empowers the City Council of the City of Normandy (the "City Council"), for the purpose of promoting health, safety, morals or the general welfare of the community, to enact ordinances regulating the use of buildings, structures, and land for trade, industry, residence or other purposes; and
WHEREAS, § 89.060 RSMo states that regulations adopted pursuant to the powers granted to municipalities by Chapter 89 RSMo may from time to time be amended, supplemented, changed, modified, or repealed; and
WHEREAS, the City Council has, pursuant to § 89.020 RSMo, enacted Section 405.705 of the Code of Ordinances regulating rear and side yard setbacks applicable to accessory buildings in all zoning districts; and
WHEREAS , the City of Normandy believes it is in the best interest of the City and its residents to revise such regulations to resolve certain ambiguities arising from the enacted text of Section 405.705; and
WHEREAS , the City Council previously referred the above amendment of Section 405.705 to the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Normandy, and the Planning and Zoning Commission forwarded a favorable recommendation of said amendment to the City Council; and
WHEREAS , the City Council of the City of Normandy, Missouri, held a public hearing thereon at Normandy City Hall on, 2025, beginning at 6:30 p.m.; and
WHEREAS, notice of said public hearing had previously been published at least 15 days prior to the hearing in the St. Louis Countian, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Normandy and otherwise posted and published in accordance with Chapter 89, RSMo and applicable City ordinances; and
WHEREAS, all persons who presented themselves and desiring to be heard were given an opportunity to be heard and a copy of the proposed ordinance has been made available for public inspection prior to its consideration by the City Council, and the Bill was read by title in open

Section 1

Section 405.705 of Chapter 405: Zoning Regulation, Article XII: Additional Use, Height, and Area Regulations and Exceptions of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Normandy is hereby amended to read as follows:

TITLE IV

LAND USE

CHAPTER 405

ZONING REGULATIONS

ARTICLE XII

ADDITIONAL USE, HEIGHT, AND AREA REGULATIONS

AND EXCEPTIONS

Section 405.705

Accessory Buildings.

- A. Accessory buildings which are not a part of the main building may be built in a <u>side or</u> rear yard. Such accessory building shall not exceed twenty-five (25) feet in height and shall not exceed the height of the main building. Such accessory building shall not occupy more than thirty percent (30%) of a required side or rear yard. An accessory building shall not be nearer than six (6) feet to any property line.
- B. Accessory buildings which are to be used for storage purposes only may be erected upon a lot prior to the construction of the main building. No accessory building shall be used for dwelling purposes. Notwithstanding the foregoing, accessory buildings in the "A" and "B" Single-Family Dwelling Districts may be used for dwelling purposes, but only by individuals listed on the occupancy permit for the main building property on which the accessory building is located. All accessory buildings used for dwelling purposes shall require an occupancy permit pursuant to Section 500.015 of this Code.

Section 2

All other Sections and Subsections of Chapter 405: Zoning Regulations, Article XII: Additional Use, Height and Area Regulations and Exceptions of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Normandy, Missouri shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3 – Repealed

All acts and parts of Ordinances or Resolutions heretofore adopted by the City in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed insofar as they conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 4 – Severability

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, phrases, and words of this ordinance are severable, and if any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word(s) of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining sections, paragraphs,

sentences, clauses, phrases, and words or this ordinance since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional or invalid portion of the ordinance.

Section 5 - Codification

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF NORMANDY, MISSOURI AMENDING SECTION 8.6 OF THE CITY OF NORMANDY PERSONNEL POLICY MANUAL

WHEREAS, the City of Normandy's insurance carrier has requested that the City make certain amendments to the provisions of its Personnel Policy Manual pertaining to motor vehicle record checks for employees who drive on behalf of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to amend the provisions of its Personnel Policy manual pertaining to these matters and find such amendments to be in the best interest of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORMANDY, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1

Section 8.6 of the City of Normandy Personnel Policy Manual is hereby amended to read as follows:

8.6 LICENSE REQUIREMENT – MOTOR VEHICLE RECORD CHECKS

- A. All employees who drive on behalf of the City must have a valid driver's license with the proper class and appropriate endorsements for the vehicles they are operating. Specific license requirements for positions may be found in the job description for a given position and may vary upon assignment of duties.
- B. Employees who drive on behalf of the City as part of their regular job duties are prohibited from driving if their license has been suspended or revoked.
- C. Any employee who regularly drives on behalf of the City, including running occasional errands, driving personal vehicles for work, or volunteers, must report all accidents, moving violation convictions and license suspensions that may occur to their supervisor immediately, regardless of whether the violation or accident was related to the employee's job duties with the City of Normandy.
- D. The City shall annually check motor vehicle records (MVRs) of all drivers who operate vehicles on behalf of the City, including running occasional errands, driving personal vehicles for work, or volunteers. Drivers may be required to authorize MVR checks depending on the state which issued their operator's license. The prior three (3) years of a driver's MVRs will be evaluated to determine if the driver has a safe driving record, needs coaching or should be removed from driving duties, based on the following criteria:

- a. <u>Clear</u> Driver has no accidents or violations and has a current and valid license in the past three years.
- b. <u>Acceptable</u> Driver has only one or two moving violations or one preventable accident on their record in the past three years.
- c. <u>Marginal</u> Driver has three moving violations, 2 preventable accidents, or a combination of two moving violations and a preventable accident in the past three years.
- d. <u>Poor</u> Driver has four or more moving violations, three or more preventable accidents, a combination of multiple moving violations and preventable accidents, or has one or more major violations (including leaving the scene of an accident, DUI, excessive speed, felony homicide or manslaughter involving the use of a motor vehicle, or license suspension or revocation resulting from accidents or moving violations) in the past three years.
- E. Drivers with marginal driver records may be subject to:
 - a. Counseling regarding their driving record
 - b. More frequent MVR checks
 - c. Additional monitoring while conducting duties to check for aggressive driving behaviors
 - d. Required driving training or classes
 - e. Revocation of a take home vehicle assignment
- F. Drivers with poor driving records shall be suspended from driving duties or reassigned to a position without driving duties. When reassignment is not practical or reasonable the employee may be suspended or terminated. If an employee faces such adverse action relating to an MVR check they shall be provided a copy of the record which led to the evaluation that the employee had a poor driving record. The employee shall have an opportunity to provide information or context relating to incidents on the driver's record.

Section 2 – Repealed

All acts and parts of Ordinances or Resolutions heretofore adopted by the City in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed insofar as they conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 3 – Severability

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, phrases, and words of this ordinance are severable, and if any section, paragraph, sentence,

clause, phrase, or word(s) of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, phrases, and words or this ordinance since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional or invalid portion of the ordinance.

Section 4 – Effective Date

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon the passage of this Ordinance and its approval by the Mayor and attested by the City Clerk.

RESOLUTION NO. 25-27

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF NORMANDY, MISSOURI, CREATING AND APPOINTING A TEMPORARY ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO ANALYZE THE CITY'S EXISTING BUILDING AND PROPERTY MAINTENANCE CODES AND CODE ENFORCEMENT PROCEDURES AND PROPOSE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF SAME.

WHEREAS, the City of Normandy has duly adopted a building code and a property maintenance code; and

WHEREAS, the City of Normandy enforces those codes using established procedures; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Normandy wishes to create a temporary advisory committee for the purpose of analyzing the City's building code and property maintenance code, reviewing the City's existing code enforcement procedures, and recommending policy revisions related to either or both of these matters.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORMANDY, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section One.	The City Council hereby creates an advisory committee to be called the "Code Committee."
Section Two.	The Code Committee shall consist of two (2) members of the City Council and four (4) citizens of the City at-large, such appointees being as follows:
Section Three.	The two (2) City Council members appointed to the Code Committee shall serve as co-chairs of the Committee, which shall be governed according to Robert's Rules of Order.
Section Four.	The Code Committee shall complete its task and submit recommendations to the City Council no later than six (6) months from the date of this Resolution unless such time is extended by the City Council.

Section Five.	The Code Committee shall meet at p.m. once per month on the fourth Wednesday of each month, unless rescheduled by the Code Committee for good cause.
Section Six.	The purpose of the Code Committee shall be limited to: the review and analysis of the City of Normandy Building Code and Property Maintenance; research and analysis of subsequent versions of the International Building Code and International Property Maintenance Code as well as similar codes adopted by other municipalities; review and analysis of the City's existing code enforcement procedures; research and analysis of code enforcement procedures utilized by other municipalities; formulation and submission of recommendations for revisions to the City's Building Code, Property Maintenance Code, and/or code enforcement procedures; and, such other tasks as necessary to accomplish the objectives of the Code Committee set forth herein.
Section Seven.	All meetings of the Code Committee shall be subject to and conducted in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 610 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri (the "Missouri Sunshine Law").
Section Eight.	Minutes for all meetings of the Code Committee shall be taken in summary format.
