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MESSAGE TO THE RESIDENTS

Welcoming Spring to Normandy!

I'm proud to say that in this first year of my mayoral term we've accomplished many goals to beautify and revitalize our great community. Already, we've given City Hall an interior and exterior facelift thanks to employee volunteers cleaning and painting the offices, plus volunteer citizens and Normandy High School students planting flowers here and at Hoetzel Park. Thanks to our City Clerk, Pam Rogers, we have a new city website, www.cityofnormandy.gov, where citizens can also pay trash bills online. In order to protect our residents and property values, we're also keeping track of vacant and derelict houses across the city.

We met with utility companies to address some concerns across the city.

- We talked with AmerenUE's forestry department regarding trees and tree limbs hazardous to power lines that will be removed in the future.
- American Water has been out testing and repainting fire hydrants in every ward and addressing multiple water line breaks in Ward 2.
- The Metropolitan Sewer District is cleaning out street lines and replacing damaged concrete caps.
- MODOT has agreed to address curb and concrete damage on Natural Bridge and other MODOT-controlled roadways in the city.

There are even more improvements coming!

- A new trash truck is on the way.
- We are pursuing a grant from the Missouri Department of Conservation to help us remove and replace dead, diseased trees from city right-of-ways in neighborhoods.
- We'll also be replacing sidewalks, and cleaning wooded areas hiding trash and debris.
- We're also looking at a system to update citizens in case of weather emergencies. Citizens will be able to sign up to receive a telephone call, email, or text message telling them about coming severe weather. You can also sign up on the website to get updates from the City through Facebook and Twitter.

Ongoing talks and improved relationships with leaders from surrounding communities, institutions and organizations in the area enable me to find the best practices that we can share in order to create and support local initiatives to benefit our communities.

Again, I thank you for your on-going support. The City Council and employees of the city are proud to serve you.

HOLIDAYS: There are 8 weeks in a calendar year that contain 9 holidays; New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Presidents' Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day together with the Friday after Thanksgiving and Christmas Day. During a week containing one of the above Holidays, our crew will work a four-day week. Regardless of what day the holiday falls on, the collection procedure is the same:

- The first work day of that week, our crew will provide service to Ward 1...
- The second work day of that week, our crew will provide service to Ward 2...
- The third work day of that week, our crew will provide service to Ward 3...
- The fourth work day of that week, our crew will provide recycling collection to all four Wards. (See holiday schedule on back page)

Recycling collection day will remain on Fridays and the collection process will remain the same. However the accepted recycling materials will increase to include the listed material below:

RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING MATERIALS ACCEPTED

The following is a list of recyclable materials accepted by Resource Management:

Co-mingled Containers:

- Aluminum Cans, Trays & Foil (trays & foil must be cleaned)
- Aseptic Packaging & Gable Top Containers (milk & juice cartons)
 Steel Cans and Tins
- PET Soda, Water, & Flavored Beverage Bottles (#1 clear and green plastic resin)
- HDPE Milk & Juice Jugs (#2 clear plastic resin)
- HDPE Detergent & Fabric Softener Containers (#2 colored plastic resin)
- PVC Narrow Neck Containers Only (#3 plastic resin); such as health & beauty aid products, household cleaners.
- LDPE Grocery Containers (#4 plastic resin); such as margarine tubs, frozen desert cups, six and twelve pack rings.
- PP Grocery Containers (#5 plastic resin); such as yogurt cups, and narrow neck syrup and ketchup bottles.
- #7 Plastic Resin Narrow Neck Containers Only.
- Plastic Buckets, such as kitty litter containers (5 gallon size maximum).
- Glass Bottles and Jars (clear, brown, green): no window glass, dinnerware or ceramics.

Notes:

- 1. All containers to be emptied and rinsed clean.
- No motor oil, insecticide, herbicide or hazardous chemical containers.
- 3. Plastic bags should be returned to grocery or department store.
- 4. No plastic film (no plastic sheets, tarps or wrap).
- 5. No expanded foam or clear polystyrene per joint advisory from the Illinois Recycling Association, Illinois Department of Commerce & Community Affairs, and Region 5 US Environmental Protection Agency.

Residential Paper Fiber:

- Newspaper, including inserts (remove plastic sleeves)
- Cardboard (no waxed cardboard)
- Kraft (brown paper) Bags
- Magazines, Catalogs and Telephone Books
- Office, Computer, Notebook & Gift Wrap Paper (no metal clips, spirals, binders)
- Chipboard (cereal, cake & food mix boxes, gift boxes, etc.)
- Carrier Stock (soda & beer can carrying cases)
- Junk Mail & Envelopes (no plastic cards, stick on labels or unused stamps)
- Paper Back Books (no hard cover books)

APPLIANCE COLLECTION: Appliances will be collected on Wednesday of every week that does not contain a holiday. Please set items out for collection by 7:00 a.m. (6:00 a.m. after Tuesday May 29th, 2007). There is a \$10.00 charge for each appliance set out for collection. These items must be prepaid at City Hall. Residents will receive a collection tag/sticker to be placed on items to be collected. Material set out for collection without tag/sticker is subject to receive a summons. Missouri Senate Bill 530 prohibits the disposal of appliances in landfills.

Appliances that require a tag to be picked up are:

Dryers Refrigerators Furnaces

PUBLIC NOTICE

The City of Normandy will hold a public hearing to discuss the allocation of \$66,000 in Community Development Block Grant funds which will become available after January 1, 2011.

The public hearing will be held at 7:30 pm on July 6, 2010, at Normandy City Hall, 7700 Natural Bridge Road, Normandy, MO 63121.

To further its commitment to fair and equitable treatment of all citizens, the City of Normandy has enacted and/or enforces the following:

HELP WANTED: The Department of Public Works has one job opening on the Street Department. This is a 40-hour weekly position with emergency call-in duty and has benefits. Anyone seeking employment in this line may file application at the front counter of City Hall.

HELP WANTED: The Department of Parks and Recreation has one (1) summer positions available for neighborhood youths. This position is 40-hours weekly including some weekend hours with no benefits. Applicants must be 16 years of age and may file application at the front counter of City Hall.

Message from the Park Board Committee:

Pride of Normandy Awards: The City of Normandy's Park Board Committee will be inspecting homes in our City for general landscaping and awarding one winning home in each of our four wards with the "Pride of Normandy" Award. There will be one "Pride of Normandy" awarded in the spring and one awarded in the summer for home beautifications and improvements. Our intent is to make mention of residents still possessing pride in their home.

The City of Normandy just received our official notice to proceed from St. Louis County on a \$66,000.00 sidewalk replacement project funded with St. Louis County's Office of Community Development money. The sealed bid packages were opened at our city hall on Monday, March 29th at 1:00 pm and the project was awarded to Midwest Mudjacking and Construction Company with whom we have had a very successful business relationship with for over 25-years. Lately Midwest Mudjacking provided the concrete replacement for two of the four phases of the street reconstruction project on Belwood Drive and Stanwood Drive. This years project calls for the removal and replacement of specified "worse-case" defective areas of concrete sidewalk throughout our city. Work should begin shortly on this project. All residents receiving concrete replacement will be notified via a flyer delivered to their home by public works staff. Some residents will be receiving sidewalk replacement in front of their driveways. This is an inconvenience not being able to you your driveway however we ask that you PLEASE do not drive on the new concrete until it has cured for 5 full days. Midwest Mudjacking will mark all construction sidewalk sites with barricades and warning tape. Once the warning tape has been removed, you may drive on the concrete. Midwest Mudiacking's plan is to only remove as much defective concrete in one day as they can re-pour the following day. This project will provide replacement of 8,797 square feet of sidewalk at 117 homes. We will provide the same sidewalk services with the upcoming C.D.B.G. Funds for this year to provide a second round of replacement for the defective sidewalks that were not bad enough to make the first round.



Red Bird Rookie Baseball Program: Our 2010 baseball season begins May 20th with league games. The Red Bird Rookie Baseball League is sponsored by the St. Louis Cardinal Care organization who provides team uniforms and gear. This will mark the begin of our fifth baseball season providing "Tee-Ball" activities to children age 5 to 7 and baseball activities to youths age 8 to 10; age 11 to 13 and age 14 to 16.

Street Sweeping Project: The City of Normandy will again contract for two citywide street sweeping events for 2010, one sweeping event is scheduled for the spring and one event during the summer.

The first citywide street sweeping operation will be scheduled for mid-May (Monday-May10th and Tuesday-May 11th). The second citywide street sweeping operation will be scheduled for mid-August (Monday-August 9th and Tuesday-August 10th). Sweeping dates may be changed by weather. Your street will be open to traffic all day and you will be able to come and go as you please. We ask that you park your vehicles in your driveway for this day so that the street sweeper will have access to all curb areas.


